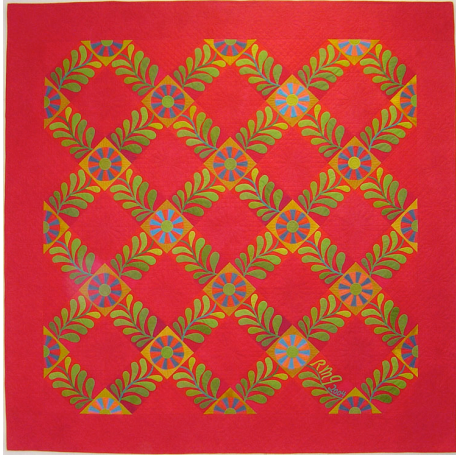
### Piece O' Cake Designs

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### Lorna's Vine

*Conquer needle-turned curved edges the Piece O' Cake way!*

Lorna's Vine is taught as a

- \*1-day class on hand appliqué techniques, or
- \*2-day class *combining* appliqué techniques and color.

The class description in the guild or quilt show brochure should tell you which one of these two versions of this class you are in

I will provide a pattern for the vine and wheel blocks and cutting instructions for a smaller version of this quilt (shown on our website).

### Supply List

**Book:** Recommended, not required

- The New Appliqué Sampler by Piece O' Cake Designs
- Amish-Inspired Quilts by Piece O' Cake Designs. You will need this book if you want to make the whole quilt.

### **Fabric for a 1-Day Appliqué Techniques Class:**

*Choose 100% cotton fabric. Pre-wash your fabric (because it appliques better). I used solid fabric but you do not need to limit yourself to solids if you don't want to.*

Vine Block Background Fabric:

- Cut 1 rectangle 8" x 10" (mine is red) — If you want to piece your background, follow the instructions in the book, Amish-Inspired Quilts.

Vine Block Appliqué Fabric:

- There won't be time in class to sew more than 1 or 2 leaves. Bring some scraps of fabric to use for leaves.

Wheel Block Fabric:

- Cut 1 square 8" x 8" for the wheel (mine are red or orange-red)
- Bring scraps of fabric for the wheel spokes (mine are blue)

### **Fabric for a 2-Day Combination Class:**

*Choose 100% cotton fabric. Pre-wash your fabric (because it appliques better). I used solid fabric but you do not need to limit yourself to solids if you don't want to..*

Vine Block Background Fabric:

- Cut 4 rectangles 8" x 10" (mine are red) — If you want to piece your backgrounds, follow the instructions in the book, Amish-Inspired Quilts.

- Cut one square 8 1/2" x 8 1/2" for the blank center setting block

Vine Block Appliqué Fabric:

- Bring a variety of scraps of fabric to use for leaves.

Wheel Block Fabric:

- Cut 4 squares 8" x 8" for wheel block backgrounds (mine are gold to orange)
- Cut 4 squares 8" x 8" for the wheel (mine are red or orange-red)
- Bring scraps of fabric for the wheel spokes (mine are blue)
- Bring scraps of fabric for the wheel centers (mine are green)

### **Basic Sewing Supplies:**

- Small, sharp, paper scissors
- Small, sharp, fabric scissors
- An ultra fine point Sharpie marker
- One 6" x 8" rectangle and one 6" x 6" square of clear upholstery vinyl in a medium weight. Keep the tissue paper that comes with the vinyl.
- Two sheets of clear, heavy weight, self-adhesive laminate – available at most office supply stores or on our website (pieceocake.com). Get the single-sided sheets, not the 2-sided pouches. Avoid repositionable laminate.
- I will supply you with 2 needles and some 1/2" sequin pins. You will need additional pins. I prefer 1/2" sequin pins for pinning appliqué.
- I will have some Superior Masterpiece 100% cotton thread for you to sew with in class. If you would like to bring thread from home to use in class, I recommend these 100% cotton threads: Superior Masterpiece, Aurifil 50 weight, Mettler 60 wt., DMC 50 wt machine embroidery thread, or YLI Soft Touch cotton. All are fine, strong, 2-ply threads.
- White Chalk Pencil (I like the General's **charcoal** pencil in white)
- A General's Sketch & Wash pencil *OR* a Quilter's Ultimate Mechanical Pencil
- A sandpaper board or bring a sheet of fine grain sandpaper if you don't have a board.
- Baggies for your templates
- For a 2-day class, bring a flannel or other **design wall** that is at least 36" x 36" and tape or pins to hang it.
- For a 2-day class, bring additional pins to pin pieces to your design wall.
- **Optional** - A light and an extension cord in case the room is dark. I have no control over whether outlets will be available in the classroom - but we can hope that there will be!
- **Optional** - Many people find that applique is easier if they have a pillow in their lap to rest their forearms on. It's a good idea to bring a pillow to class for this purpose.
